APPLICATION AND INTERPRETATION OF THE RULES

**Court documents to be sealed**

**2.6.**—(1) The court must seal<sup>(GL)</sup> the following documents on issue—

- (a) the claim form; and
- (b) any other document which a rule or practice direction requires it to seal.

[<sup>F1</sup>(2) The court may place the seal on the document by hand, by printing or electronically.]

(3) A document [<sup>F2</sup>appearing] to bear the court's seal<sup>(GL)</sup> shall be admissible in evidence without further proof.
