The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 26(2)(bb) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990<sup>M1</sup> and sections 334(7), 335(2)(b) and (d), 3(d) and 7(b), 337(4) and (5), 338(8), 342(1)(b) and 343 of the Greater London Authority Act 1999<sup>M2</sup> and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and having consulted the Lord Chancellor<sup>M3</sup> hereby makes the following Regulations:—
