# The Borough of South Ribble (Electoral Changes) (Amendment) Order 2002

Made - - - - 26th March 2002

*Coming into force in accordance with article* 1(2)

Whereas the Local Government Commission for England, acting pursuant to section 15(4) of the Local Government Act  $1992(\mathbf{a})$ , has submitted to the Secretary of State a report dated September 2000 on its review of the borough(**b**) of South Ribble together with its recommendations;

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to those recommendations;

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 17(c) and 26 of the Local Government Act 1992, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

#### Citation and commencement

**1.**—(1) This Order may be cited as the Borough of South Ribble (Electoral Changes) (Amendment) Order 2002.

(2) This Order shall come into force on the day after that on which it is made.

#### Amendment to the 2001 Order

2. In article 7(2) of the Borough of South Ribble (Electoral Changes) Order 2001(d) for the word "Castle" there shall be substituted "Howick and Priory".
