SCHEDULE 1 — REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO PREMISES WHERE A DESIGNATED DISEASE IS SUSPECTED OR CONFIRMED
PART I — PREMISES ON WHICH A DESIGNATED DISEASE IS SUSPECTED

1. Record of Poultry
 2. Isolation of poultry
 3. Prohibition on movement of poultry to or from premises
 4. Prohibition on movement of persons, animals and vehicles to or from the premises
 5. Prohibition on removal or spreading of things liable to transmit disease
 6. Restriction on removal of eggs
 7. Disinfection at entrances and exits
- PART II — PREMISES ON WHICH A DESIGNATED DISEASE IS CONFIRMED
8. Slaughter and destruction
 9. Destruction or treatment
 10. Tracing
 11. Disinfection and restocking

SCHEDULE 2 — INFECTED AREAS: PROTECTION AND SURVEILLANCE ZONES
