Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for Work and Pensions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 79(1) and 84 of, and paragraph 9 of Schedule 2 to, the Social Security Act 1998(**3**) and paragraphs 6(4)(b), 20(1)(b) and 23(1) of Schedule 7 to the Child Support, Pensions and Social Security Act 2000(**4**) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, after consultation, in respect of regulation 3, with both the Council on Tribunals in accordance with section 8(1) of the Tribunals and Inquiries Act 1992(**5**) and with organisations appearing to him to be representative of the authorities concerned(**6**) and after agreement by the Social Security Advisory Committee that proposals in respect of these Regulations should not be referred to it(7), hereby makes the following Regulations:
