**The Greenhouse Gas Emissions Trading Scheme  
(Approved National Allocation Plan) Regulations 2005**

The Secretary of State, being a Minister designated(1) for the purposes of subsection (2) of section 2 of the European Communities Act 1972(2) in relation to greenhouse gas emission allowance trading, in exercise of the powers conferred upon her by that subsection, makes the following Regulations:

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Trading Scheme (Approved National Allocation Plan) Regulations 2005 and shall come into force on 14th June 2005.

**Specification of approved national allocation plan**

2. For the purposes of the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Trading Scheme Regulations 2005(3), the document entitled “Approved National Allocation Plan 2005-2007” published by the Secretary of State on 24th May 2005 is specified as the approved national allocation plan for the three year period beginning on 1st January 2005.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations specify the document which is the approved national allocation plan for the first three-year period (beginning on 1st January 2005) of the European Union's Greenhouse Gas Emissions Trading Scheme for the purposes of the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Trading Scheme Regulations 2005 (S.I.2005/925). These Regulations extend to the United Kingdom.
