PENSIONS

The Pensions (Polish Forces) Scheme (Amendment) Order 2005

Made - - - - *26th October 2005*

Coming into force - - *5th December 2005*

The Secretary of State for Defence, with the consent of the Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1 of the Polish Resettlement Act 1947(1) and now vested in him(2), hereby makes the following Order:

Citation, interpretation and commencement

1. This Order, which may be cited as the Pensions (Polish Forces) Scheme (Amendment) Order 2005, amends the Pensions (Polish Forces) Scheme 1964(3) (hereinafter referred to as “the Scheme”) and shall come into force on 5th December 2005.

Amendment of article 11 of the Scheme

2. In article 11 (Awards not payable to or in respect of persons in Poland) after the word “widow,” insert “surviving civil partner,”.
