DANGEROUS DRUGS

The Misuse of Drugs (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations 2005

Made - - - - *6th December 2005*
Laid before Parliament *8th December 2005*
Coming into force - - *1st January 2006*

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 7, 10, 22 and 31 of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971(1).

In accordance with section 31(3) of that Act he has consulted with the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Misuse of Drugs (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations 2005 and shall come into force on 1st January 2006.

Amendment of the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 2001

2. In Part 1 of Schedule 4 to the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 2001(2) (which specifies some of the controlled drugs that are subject to the requirements of regulations 22, 23, 26 and 27 and for which provision is made by certain other regulations), in paragraph 1 after “4-Hydroxy-n-butyric acid” insert “Ketamine”(3).
