**The Pension Protection Fund (Review and
Reconsideration of Reviewable Matters) Regulations 2005**

The Secretary of State for Work and Pensions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 207, 315(2), (4) and (5) and 318(1) of the Pensions Act 2004 ^{M1}, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, after consultation with the Council on Tribunals in accordance with section 8 of the Tribunals and Inquiries Act 1992 ^{M2}, by this instrument, which contains regulations made before the end of the period of six months beginning with the coming into force of the provisions of the Act by virtue of which they are made ^{M3}, hereby makes the following Regulations:

- M3** See section 317(2)(c) of the Pensions Act 2004 which provides that the Secretary of State must consult such persons as he considers appropriate before making regulations by virtue of the provisions of that Act (other than Part 8). This duty does not apply where regulations are made before the end of six months beginning with the coming into force of the provisions of that Act by virtue of which the regulations are made.
