Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Graduated Retirement Benefit) (Amendment) Regulations 2005 and shall come into force on 5th April 2005.

Amendment of the Social Security (Graduated Retirement Benefit) Regulations 2005

2. In regulation 1(2) of the Social Security (Graduated Retirement Benefit) Regulations 2005(c) (effect), for "paragraphs 3(2) and (3) and 13(2) and (3)" there shall be substituted "paragraphs 4(2) and (3) and 14(2) and (3)".
