The Secretary of State, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by section 86(10) and (12) of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999(**a**), makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration Services Commissioner (Designated Professional Body) (Fees) Order 2006 and shall come into force on 16th March 2006.

Fees

2.—(1) The fee to be paid to the Immigration Services Commissioner by each designated professional body for the year 1^{st} April 2005 to 31^{st} March 2006 shall be the sum specified in the Schedule to this Order.

(2) The fee shall be paid on or before 31^{st} March 2006.

The fees specified in the Schedule to this Order reflect the referable costs incurred in the course of the Commissioner's regulatory activity in the period 1st April 2004 to 31st March 2005.
