The Borough of Taunton Deane (Electoral Changes) Order 2007

Made 25th January 2007

Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

The Boundary Committee for England(1), under section 15(4)(2) of the Local Government Act 1992(3) ("the 1992 Act"), have conducted a review of the borough(4) of Taunton Deane and have submitted to the Electoral Commission(5) recommendations dated July 2006.

A period of not less than six weeks has expired since the receipt of those recommendations.

The Electoral Commission have decided to give effect, without modification, to those recommendations.

Accordingly, the Electoral Commission, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 17(6) and 26(7) of the 1992 Act, make the following Order:
