## CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS, ENGLAND

The Childcare (Provision of Information About Young Children) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2008

Made - - - - 26th November 2008

Laid before Parliament 4th December 2008

Coming into force - - 1st January 2009

The Secretary of State for Children, Schools and Families makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 99(1) and 104(2) of the Childcare Act 2006(a):

#### Citation, commencement, and application

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Childcare (Provision of Information About Young Children) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2008 and come into force on 1st January 2009.
  - (2) These Regulations apply only in relation to England.

# Amendment to the Childcare (Provision of Information About Young Children) (England) Regulations 2008

- **2.**—(1) The Childcare (Provision of Information About Young Children) (England) Regulations 2008(**b**) are amended as follows.
- (2) In Regulation 4(3) after "is requested" insert "and the item of information at paragraph 10 of Part 2 of the Schedule if requested".

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Childcare (Provision of Information About Young Children) (England) Regulations 2008 (S.I. 2008/1722). Regulation 4(3) requires providers of early years provision who are exempt from registration under section 34(2) of the Childcare Act 2006 (provision for children aged 3 or over at certain schools) to supply the information set out in Part 1 of the Schedule to the local authority in whose area the funded early years provision is provided. The providers who are exempt from registration are those providing childcare for children from age 3 to the 1<sup>st</sup> September following their fifth birthday at a maintained school, non-maintained special school or an independent school, where that provision is made by the school and one or more pupils attend it.

These Regulations amend Regulation 4(3) so that these schools are also required to provide the information contained in paragraph 10 of Part 2 of the Schedule which is the number of hours of funded early years provision that each child receives per week.
