**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A36 Trunk Road (Warminster and Heytesbury Bypass,  
Wiltshire) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic)  
Order 2009**

*Made* - - - - *7 October 2009*  
*Coming into force* - - *10 October 2009*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A36 Trunk Road (“the A36”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road near Warminster in Wiltshire should be prohibited and restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Warminster and Heytesbury Bypass, Wiltshire) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 10 October 2009.

2. In this Order -

“the A36” means the A36 Warminster and Heytesbury Bypass from the southern edge of the A350 Bath Road (Warminster Services) Roundabout to its junction with the B390 at the Knook Camp Junction, Heytesbury;

“the works” mean verge vegetation management works;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed; and in this definition "carriageway" means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“the first works period” means a period of 6 hours starting at 09.30 hours on Monday 12 October 2009 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

“the second works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 12 October 2009 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the first works period or the second works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or remain in the layby adjacent to:

- (a) the eastern side of the A36 situated 870 metres south of centre of the A350 Bath Road (Warminster Services) Roundabout;
- (b) the western side of the A36 situated 1400 metres south of the centre of the A350 Bath Road (Warminster Services) Roundabout;
- (c) the southern side of the A36 situated 500 metres east of the centre of the Cley Hill Roundabout;
- (d) the northern side of the A36 situated 950 metres east of the centre of the Cley Hill Roundabout;
- (e) the southern side of the A36 situated 460 metres east of the centre of the Crockerton Roundabout;
- (f) the northern side of the A36 situated 1620 metres east of the centre of the Crockerton Roundabout;
- (g) the southern side of the A36 situated 450 metres west of the centre of the B3095 Overbridge;
- (h) the southern side of the A36 situated 660 metres east of the centre of the B3095 Overbridge;
- (i) the northern side of the A36 situated 1260 metres east of the centre of the B3095 Overbridge.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the first works period or the second works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the A36.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 only apply during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority, ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer in uniform.

6. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to a vehicle being used for traffic officer purposes or anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a traffic officer in uniform or in connection with the said works.
