FLOOD HAZARD MAPS AND FLOOD RISK MAPS

Duty to prepare flood hazard maps and flood risk maps: Environment Agency

18.— $[^{F1}(1)]$ The Environment Agency must prepare in relation to $[^{F2}$ each relevant flood risk area]—

- (a) a flood hazard map relating to the risk of flooding from-
 - (i) the sea,
 - (ii) main rivers, and
 - (iii) reservoirs, and
- (b) a flood risk map.
- [^{F3}(2) "Relevant flood risk area" means—
 - (a) a flood risk area identified by the Environment Agency under regulation 13, and
 - (b) a flood risk area in an English cross border area in which the Secretary of State and Scottish Ministers have identified (under regulation 14A) that there is a significant flood risk from—
 - (i) the sea,
 - (ii) main rivers, or
 - (iii) reservoirs.]
