ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A23 Trunk Road (Pyecombe, Southbound Lay-By)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - *6th April 2010*

Coming into force - - *10th April 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A23 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A23 Trunk Road (Pyecombe, Southbound Lay-By) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 10th April 2010.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A23 Trunk Road in the County of West Sussex;

“lay-by” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b);

“the A23 lay-by” means the lay-by in the southbound carriageway of the trunk road immediately south of Pangdean Farm at Pyecombe;

“works” mean BT cabling work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 9 hours starting at 2100 hours on Monday 12th April 2010 or on any subsequent day until 9th October 2011.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in, or wait on, the A23 lay-by.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or

(d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
