## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The A1 Trunk Road (Markham Moor, Nottinghamshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

 Made
 02 July 2010

 Coming into force
 09 July 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A1 Trunk Road ("the A1") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on two of those connecting roads at Markham Moor in the County of Nottinghamshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A1 Trunk Road (Markham Moor, Nottinghamshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 9 July 2010.

## **2.** In this Order:

"a slip road" means –

i) the slip road leading from the northbound carriageway of the A1 to its roundabout junction with the B1164 Great North Road and Milton Road at Markham Moor Interchange;

ii) the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the A1 from its roundabout junction with the A57 and A638 at Markham Moor Interchange.

"the works period" means the period starting at 20.00 hours on Tuesday 13

July 2010 and ending when the said works have been

completed,

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
  - **5.** The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle-
    - (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes,
    - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or
    - (iii) being used in connection with the said works.
