ROAD TRAFFIC

The M4 Motorway (Junctions 8/9 – 7, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - - *1st February 2010*
Coming into force - - - *6th February 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that motorway and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Junctions 8/9 – 7, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 6th February 2010.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway” means the M4 Motorway in the Borough of Slough and the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead;

“the length of eastbound carriageway” means the eastbound carriageway of the motorway between Junction 8/9 (A404(M)/A308(M)) and the slip road leading from Huntercombe Spur at Junction 7 (A4 – Bath Road);

“the slip road” means the road leading from the A404(M)/A308(M) to the eastbound carriageway of the motorway at Junction 8/9;

“works” mean essential carriageway repairs and all associated work on the motorway; and

“a works period” means a period of 8 hours starting at 2200 hours on Monday 8th February 2010 or on any subsequent day until 5th August 2011.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of eastbound carriageway or the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;

- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
