**The A500 Trunk Road (Etruria, Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire)
(Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - 29 December 2010

Coming into force - - 5 January 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A500 Trunk Road (“the A500”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on two of those connecting roads at Etruria in the City of Stoke-on-Trent in the County of Staffordshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A500 Trunk Road (Etruria, Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 5 January 2011.

2. In this Order:

“a slip road” means the slip road leading –

(i) from the northbound carriageway of the A500 to its junction with the B5045 Shelton New Road; and

(ii) to the southbound carriageway of the A500 from its junction with the B5045 Shelton New Road;

“the works period” means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 10 January 2011 and ending when the said works have been completed,

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle-

- (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes,
- (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or
- (iii) being used in connection with the said works.
