The Houses in Multiple Occupation (Specified Educational Establishments) (England) Regulations 2010

Citation, commencement and application

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Houses in Multiple Occupation (Specified Educational Establishments) (England) Regulations 2010 and shall come into force on 6th April 2010.

(2) These Regulations apply in relation to England only.

Educational establishments specified for certain purposes of the Housing Act 2004

2. An educational establishment is specified for the purposes of paragraph 4 of Schedule 14 to the Housing Act 2004 where—

- (a) it is listed in the Schedule to these Regulations; and
- (b) it is listed as the relevant educational establishment in respect of a building—
 - (i) listed on or before 23rd December 2009 in the Schedule annexed to The Universities UK/Standing Conference of Principals Code of Practice for the Management of Student Housing dated 20th February 2006⁽¹⁾; or
 - (ii) listed on or before 18th January 2010 in the second column of Schedule 1 of Appendix VII to the ANUK/Unipol Code of Standards for Larger Developments for Student Accommodation Managed and Controlled by Educational Establishments dated 28th August 2008⁽²⁾.

Revocation of earlier Regulations

3. The Houses in Multiple Occupation (Specified Educational Establishments) (England) Regulations 2009⁽³⁾ are revoked.
