The Young People's Learning Agency Abolition (Consequential Amendments to Subordinate Legislation) (England) Order 2012

Amendment of the Income Support (General) Regulations 1987

3.—(1) The Income Support (General) Regulations 1987^{M1} are amended as follows.

(2) In regulation 2(1) (interpretation) in paragraph (a) of the definition of "training allowance" omit "the Young People's Learning Agency for England,".

(3) In regulation 61(1) (interpretation)—

- (a) in paragraph (d) of the definition of "access funds"—
 - (i) for "Young People's Learning Agency for England under sections 61 and 62 of the Apprenticeships, Skills, Children and Learning Act 2009" substitute "Secretary of State under section 14 of the Education Act 2002 "^{M2}, and
 - (ii) for "that Act" substitute " the Apprenticeships, Skills, Children and Learning Act 2009 ";
- (b) in the definition of "full-time course of advanced education"—
 - (i) in paragraphs (a) and (b) for "Young People's Learning Agency for England" substitute "Secretary of State under section 14 of the Education Act 2002 " in each place where those words occur, and
 - (ii) in paragraph (b)(i) for "bodies" substitute " persons "; and
- (c) in the definition of "full-time course of study"—
 - (i) in paragraphs (a) and (b) for "Young People's Learning Agency for England" substitute "Secretary of State under section 14 of the Education Act 2002 " in each place where those words occur, and
 - (ii) in paragraph (b)(i) for "bodies" substitute " persons ".

(4) In paragraph 28 of Schedule 1B (persons engaged in training) for "Young People's Learning Agency for England" substitute "Secretary of State".
