The Welfare of Animals at the Time of Killing (Revocation) Regulations 2014

Made - - - - 15th May 2014
Laid before Parliament 16th May 2014
Coming into force - - 19th May 2014

The Secretary of State is designated for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972(1) in relation to the common agricultural policy of the European Union(2) and makes these Regulations in exercise of those powers, and the powers conferred by paragraph 1A of Schedule 2 to that Act, and with the consent of the Treasury under section 56(1) of the Finance Act 1973(3).

Citation and commencement

- **1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Welfare of Animals at the Time of Killing (Revocation) Regulations 2014.
 - (2) These Regulations come into force on 19th May 2014.

Revocation

2. The Welfare of Animals at the Time of Killing Regulations 2014(4) are revoked.
