**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The M621 Motorway (Junction 1 and Junction 6) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

*Made* - - - *30th October 2014*

*Coming into force* - *7th November 2014*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M621 Motorway and connecting roads, in the District of Leeds, in the County of West Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on some of those connecting roads should be prohibited because carriageway resurfacing, surveys and routine maintenance works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order:

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M621 Motorway (Junction 1 and Junction 6) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 7th November 2014.

**2.** In this Order:-

“the M621” means the M621 Motorway;

“a slip road” means any of the following M621 slip roads:

- (i) clockwise entry slip road at Junction 1 (Beeston); or
- (ii) clockwise exit slip road at Junction 6 (Belle Isle).

“the first works period” means a period of 13 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Saturday 8th November 2014 or any subsequent Saturday or Friday night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

“the second works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Sunday 9th November 2014 or any subsequent Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 no person shall during the first works period and the second works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

**4.** The provisions of article 2 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
