## AGRICULTURE PLANT HEALTH, ENGLAND SEEDS

The Seeds and Vegetable Plant Material (Nomenclature Changes) Regulations 2014

Made - - - - 4th March 2014

Laid before Parliament 6th March 2014

Coming into force - - 31st March 2014

The Secretary of State is designated(1) for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972(2) in relation to the common agricultural policy.

The Secretary of State has carried out consultation in accordance with section 16(1) of the Plant Varieties and Seeds Act 1964(3).

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers in section 16(1) and (1A) of the Plant Varieties and Seeds Act 1964 and section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972.
