

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO
THE MESOTHELIOMA LUMP SUM PAYMENTS (CONDITIONS AND
AMOUNTS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2014

2014 No. 868

1. This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Work and Pensions and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

2. **Purpose of the instrument**

The 2008 Diffuse Mesothelioma Scheme (the 2008 scheme) provides for lump sum compensation payments to people suffering from mesothelioma, or to their dependants, who have not received a payment for mesothelioma under the Pneumoconiosis etc (Workers' Compensation) Act 1979. The compensation payments are set according to the age of the sufferer. This instrument increases the amounts of compensation paid to sufferers, or their dependants, under the 2008 scheme by 2.7%..

3. **Matters of special interest to the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments.**

None.

4. **Legislative Context**

There is no statutory obligation to increase the rates of payments under the 2008 scheme. However, the Government has reviewed the rates in order to maintain their value in line with inflation. This instrument increases the current rates of payment set out in the Mesothelioma Lump Sum Payments (Conditions and Amounts) Regulations 2008 (as amended) by 2.7%.

5. **Territorial Extent and Application**

This instrument applies to Great Britain.

6. **European Convention on Human Rights**

The Minister for Disabled People, Mike Penning MP has made the following statement regarding Human Rights:

In my view the provisions of The Mesothelioma Lump Sum Payments (Conditions and Amounts) (Amendment) Regulations 2014 are compatible with the Convention rights.

7. **Policy background**

7.1. The 2008 Mesothelioma Scheme (the 2008 scheme) as set out in Part 4 of the Child Maintenance and Other Payments Act 2008 pays a lump sum to people with mesothelioma, or to their dependants where the sufferers were unable to claim in their lifetime.

7.2. Although there is no statutory obligation to increase the payments in line with inflation, the Government decided to increase the amounts set out in the Mesothelioma Lump Sum Payments (Conditions and Amounts) Regulations by 2.7% - the rate of inflation as measured by the September 2013 Consumer Prices Index, and in line with Industrial Injury Benefits and other Social Security disability benefits.

- **Consolidation**

7.3. This instrument increases the rates paid under the 2008 scheme and therefore consolidation is not relevant.

8. **Consultation outcome**

Consultation is not necessary as these increases are at the rate of inflation as measured by the Consumer Prices Index, and are in line with Industrial Injury Benefits and other Social Security disability benefits rates which are increased under the existing statutory provisions.

9. **Guidance**

A guidance bulletin detailing new rates will be issued to claim processors in the DWP Barrow office with responsibility for processing these claims.

10. **Impact**

10.1. This instrument has no impact on business and civil society organisations.

10.2. The impact on the public sector is negligible.

10.3. An impact assessment has not been prepared for this instrument.

11. **Regulating small business**

This instrument does not apply to small business.

12. **Monitoring & review**

The changes in the payable rate aim to maintain the value of payments in line with inflation. It is intended that these rates will be reviewed each year.
