# **CONSULTANT LOBBYING**

# The Registration of Consultant Lobbyists (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2015

Made - - - - 9th December 2015

Laid before Parliament 10th December 2015

Coming into force - - 1st January 2016

The Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster makes these Regulations in exercise of the power conferred by section 22(2) of the Transparency of Lobbying, Non-Party Campaigning and Trade Union Administration Act 2014(a).

## Citation, extent and commencement

- **1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Registration of Consultant Lobbyists (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2015.
  - (2) These Regulations extend to the United Kingdom.
  - (3) These Regulations come into force on 1st January 2016.

## Amendment of the Registration of Consultant Lobbyists Regulations 2015

**2.** In regulation 5(1)(c) of the Registration of Consultant Lobbyists Regulations 2015(**b**) for "£700" in both places it appears substitute "£950".

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend regulation 5 of the Registration of Consultant Lobbyists Regulations 2015 to increase the annual charge per registered consultant lobbyist in connection with the

maintenance of the register. The annual charge will increase from £700 to £950 per calendar year. If a person joins the register part way through a year, the annual charge will be calculated as the appropriate proportion of £950 for the remainder of that calendar year.

A regulatory impact assessment has not been prepared for these Regulations as no or minimal impact on the public, voluntary or private sectors is foreseen. A regulatory impact assessment has been prepared as to the likely cost and benefits of complying with the Registration of Consultant Lobbyists Regulations 2015.
