PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

**The European Union (Recognition of
Professional Qualifications) Regulations 2015**

Made - - - - *17th December 2015*
Laid before Parliament *21st December 2015*
Coming into force - - *18th January 2016*

The Secretary of State is designated ^{M1} for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 ^{M2} in relation to recognition of higher education diplomas, formal qualifications, or experience in the occupation, required for the pursuit of professions or occupations.

These Regulations make provision for a purpose mentioned in section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 and it appears to the Secretary of State that it is expedient for certain references to provisions of European Union instruments to be construed as references to those provisions as amended from time to time.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred under section 2(2) of, as read with paragraph 1A of Schedule 2 ^{M3} to, the European Communities Act 1972.
