The Lambeth College (Designated Institution in Further Education) Order 2018

The Secretary of State for Education makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 28 of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992(1).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Lambeth College (Designated Institution in Further Education) Order 2018 and comes into force on 31st January 2019.

Designation

2. Lambeth College(**2**), being an educational institution of the kind described in subsections (1) and (2) of section 28 of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992, is designated as an institution for the purposes of that section.
