The Personal Injuries (Civilians) Scheme (Amendment) Order 2018

Made - - - - 20th February 2018

Laid before Parliament 8th March 2018

Coming into force - - 9th April 2018

The Secretary of State, with the approval of the Treasury, makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1 and 2 of the Personal Injuries (Emergency Provisions) Act 1939(a).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Personal Injuries (Civilians) Scheme (Amendment) Order 2018 and comes into force on 9th April 2018.

Amendment of the Personal Injuries (Civilians) Scheme 1983

- **2.**—(1) The Personal Injuries (Civilians) Scheme 1983(**b**) ("the Scheme") is amended as follows.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order amends the Personal Injuries (Civilians) Scheme 1983 ("the Scheme"), which makes provision for the payment of pensions and allowances to, or in respect of, civilians who were killed or injured during the 1939-1945 World War.

Paragraphs (2) and (3) of article 2 of this Order substitute the tables in Schedules 3 and 4 to the Scheme respectively, in order to adjust the rates prescribed for pensions and allowances in respect of disablement or death.

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no, or no significant, impact on the private, voluntary or public sectors is foreseen.

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
