# 2018 No. 482

## The Ionising Radiation (Basic Safety Standards) (Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2018

### PART 1

#### General

#### Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Ionising Radiation (Basic Safety Standards) (Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2018 and come into force on 8th May 2018.

#### Interpretation

2. In these Regulations—

“Basic Safety Standards Directive” means Council Directive 2013/59/Euratom laying down basic safety standards for protection against the dangers arising from exposure to ionising radiation and repealing Directives 89/618/Euratom, 90/641/Euratom, 96/29/Euratom, 97/43/Euratom and 2003/122/Euratom <sup>M1</sup>;

“building material” <sup>M2</sup>, “effective dose” <sup>M3</sup>, “emergency” <sup>M4</sup>, “equivalent dose” <sup>M5</sup>, “ionising radiation” <sup>M6</sup>, “orphan source” <sup>M7</sup> and “practice” <sup>M8</sup> have the same meaning as in the Basic Safety Standards Directive.
