# MERCHANT SHIPPING

# The Merchant Shipping (Maritime Labour Convention) (Hours of Work) Regulations 2018

Made - - - - 29th January 2018
Laid before Parliament 6th February 2018
Coming into force - - 6th April 2018

Whereas the Secretary of State is a Minister designated for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 M1 in relation to measures relating to the safety of ships and the health and safety of persons on them M2.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 and sections 85(1)(a) and (b), (3), (5) and (7) and 86(1) and (2) of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995 M3.

In accordance with section 86(4) of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995 the Secretary of State has consulted the persons referred to in that section.
