The Universal Credit and Employment and Support Allowance (Terminal Illness) (Amendment) Regulations 2022

Amendments of the definition of when a person is "terminally ill"

- **2.**—(1) In the definition of "terminally ill" in regulation 2(1) of the Employment and Support Allowance Regulations 2008(1), for "6 months" substitute "12 months".
- (2) In the definition of "terminally ill" in regulation 2 of the Universal Credit Regulations 2013(2), for "6 months" substitute "12 months".
- (3) In the definition of "terminally ill" in regulation 2 of the Employment and Support Allowance Regulations 2013(3), for "six months" substitute "12 months".
- (4) For the definition of "terminally ill" in regulation 2 of the Universal Credit, Personal Independence Payment, Jobseeker's Allowance and Employment and Support Allowance (Decisions and Appeals) Regulations 2013(4) substitute—

""terminally ill" in relation to a claimant, means that the claimant is suffering from a progressive disease and that death in consequence of that disease can reasonably be expected—

- (a) within 12 months in the case of universal credit or an employment and support allowance;
- (b) within 6 months in any other case;".
