The Secretary of State⁽¹⁾, considering that the condition in section 45(2) of the Sanctions and Anti-Money Laundering Act 2018⁽²⁾ is met, makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1, 3(1)(b)(ii) and (d)(ii), 5(1), 15(2)(a) and (b) and (6) and 45 of, and paragraphs 2(a)(ii) and (b), 4(a)(ii) and (b), (c) and (d), 5(a)(ii) and (b), 6(a)(ii) and (b), 7(a)(ii) and (b), 11(a)(ii), 13(b), (c), (g), (h), (k), (l), (n), (q) and (w), 14(f), (g) and (k), 17(a), 19(a), 20(c) and (d), 21, 22 and 23 of Schedule 1 to, that Act.

(1) The power to make regulations under Part 1 of the Sanctions and Anti-Money Laundering Act 2018 (c. 13) is conferred on an appropriate Minister. Section 1(9)(a) of the Act defines an “appropriate Minister” as including the Secretary of State.
