## The Slough (Electoral Changes) Order 2023

## Citation, commencement, extent and application

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Slough (Electoral Changes) Order 2023.
- (2) This article and article 2 come into force on the day after the day on which this Order is made.
- (3) Articles 3 comes into force—
  - (a) for the purpose of proceedings preliminary or relating to the election of councillors(1), on the day after the day on which this Order is made;
  - (b) for all other purposes, on the ordinary day of election of councillors in England(2) in 2023.
- (4) This Order extends to England and Wales but applies in relation to England only.

<sup>(1)</sup> Slough Borough Council at a meeting on 18th January 2022 resolved to move to four-yearly whole council elections, where all councillors will be elected collectively for a period of four years commencing with local elections to be held in 2023.
