The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Spalding Flower Show) Regulations 2023

Made - - - - *11th May 2023*

Coming into force - - *13th May 2023*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict the flying of unmanned aircraft in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended gathering there of a large number of persons at the Spalding Flower Show.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Spalding Flower Show) Regulations 2023 and they come into force on 13th May 2023.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0800 hours and 1800 hours on 13th May 2023 no unmanned aircraft is to fly below 500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 0.6 nautical miles centred at 524729N 0000853W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any unmanned aircraft operating with the permission of Lincolnshire Police.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on the flying of unmanned aircraft in the vicinity of Spalding, Lincolnshire during the Spalding Flower Show that is scheduled to take place there on 13th May 2023.

A large number of spectators are due to attend the Show and therefore Lincolnshire Police considers that the flying of unmanned aircraft should be restricted in the vicinity of the Spalding Flower showground for reasons of public safety and security. The restrictions have been agreed by the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2), Lincolnshire Police may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Briefing Sheet and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
