**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Flying Legends,  
Leeds East) Regulations 2023**

*Made* - - - - *12th June 2023*

*Coming into force* - - *15th July 2023*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict the flying of aircraft in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding there of flying displays associated with the Flying Legends Air Show 2023.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Flying Legends, Leeds East) Regulations 2023 and they come into force on 15th July 2023.

**Interpretation**

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

**Restricted airspace**

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1100 hours and 1800 hours on 15th July 2023 and 16th July 2023 no aircraft is to fly below 5,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3 nautical miles centred at 535004N 0011144W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by the Leeds East Airshow flying display director.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Leeds East Aerodrome during air displays associated with the Flying Legends Air Show 2023 that are scheduled to take place there on 15th July 2023 and 16th July 2023.

In order to protect the display aircraft, other air traffic and spectators, the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2), the Leeds East Air Show flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Briefing Sheet and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
