Rheoliadau Labelu Bwyd (Diwygio) (Cymru) 2005

NODYN ESBONIADOL

(*Nid yw'r nodyn hwn yn rhan o'r Rheoliadau*)

1. Mae'r Rheoliadau hyn yn diwygio ymhellach Reoliadau Labelu Bwyd 1996 i'r graddau y maent yn gymwys o ran Cymru. Mae Rheoliadau 1996 yn rhychwantu Prydain Fawr i gyd. Mae'r Rheoliadau hyn yn rhoi ar waith yng Nghymru Gyfarwyddeb y Comisiwn 2004/77/EC sy'n diwygio Cyfarwyddeb 94/54/EC o ran labelu bwydydd penodol sy'n cynnwys asid glysirhisinig a'i halwyn amoniwm (OJ Rhif L162, 30.4.2004, t.76).

2. Mae asid glysirhisinig yn digwydd yn naturiol yn y planhigyn perwraidd, a gweithgynhyrchir ei halwyn amoniwm o echdynion dyfrllyd y planhigyn hwnnw. Mae'r Rheoliadau hyn yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i gyffaith a diodydd sy'n cynnwys lefelau penodol o'r asid neu'r halwyn hwnnw gael eu labelu â'r dangosiad "contains liquorice" a bod rhybudd yn cael ei ychwanegu mewn rhai achosion (rheoliad 7). Ceir esempiadau rhag y gofynion labelu hyn yn achos bwyd nad yw wedi'i ragbecynnu, bwyd sydd wedi'i ragbecynnu i'w werthu'n uniongyrchol, cynhyrchion cyffaith ffansi, pecynnau bach a photeli gwydr penodol sydd wedi'u marcio'n annileadwy (rheoliadau 4 i 6). Mae'r Rheoliadau hyn hefyd yn cynnwys darpariaeth drosiannol (rheoliad 8) ac yn diweddarwr diffiniad o "Directive 94/54" (rheoliad 3).

3. Mae arfarniad rheoliadol yn unol ag adran 65 o Ddeddf Llywodraeth Cymru 1998 wedi'i baratoi ar gyfer y Rheoliadau hyn a'i osod yn Llyfrgell Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru ynghyd â Nodyn Trosi yn nodi sut y mae prif elfennau Cyfarwyddeb 2003/120/EC wedi'u

The Food Labelling (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(*This note is not part of the Regulations*)

1. These Regulations further amend the Food Labelling Regulations 1996 in so far as they apply in relation to Wales. The 1996 Regulations extend to the whole of Great Britain. These Regulations implement in Wales Commission Directive 2004/77/EC which amends Directive 94/54/EC as regards the labelling of certain foods containing glycyrrhizic acid and its ammonium salt (OJ No. L162, 30.4.2004, p.76).

2. Glycyrrhizic acid occurs naturally in the liquorice plant, and its ammonium salt is manufactured from aqueous extracts of that plant. These Regulations require confectionery and drinks containing certain levels of that acid or salt to be labelled with the indication "contains liquorice" and for this to be coupled with a warning in certain cases (regulation 7). There are exemptions from these labelling requirements in the case of food which is not prepacked, food which is prepacked for direct sale, fancy confectionery products, small packages and certain indelibly marked glass bottles (regulations 4 to 6). These Regulations also contain a transitional provision (regulation 8) and update the definition of "Directive 94/54" (regulation 3).

3. A regulatory appraisal pursuant to section 65 of the Government of Wales Act 1998 has been prepared for these Regulations and placed in the Library of the National Assembly for Wales together with a Transposition Note setting out how the main elements

The Food Labelling (Amendment)
(Wales) Regulations 2005*Made**10 May 2005**Coming into force**20 May 2006*

The National Assembly for Wales, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 16(1)(e) and (f), 17, 26(1) and (3) and 48(1) of the Food Safety Act 1990⁽¹⁾ and now vested in it⁽²⁾, having had regard in accordance with section 48(4A) of that Act to relevant advice given by the Food Standards Agency and after consultation as required by Article 9 of Regulation (EC) No. 178/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council⁽³⁾ laying down the general principles and requirements of food law, establishing the European Food Safety Authority and laying down procedures in matters of food safety, makes the following Regulations:

Title, application and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food Labelling (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005; they apply in relation to Wales only and come into force on 20 May 2006.

Amendment of the Food Labelling Regulations 1996

2. The Food Labelling Regulations 1996⁽⁴⁾ are amended (in so far as they apply in relation to Wales) in accordance with regulations 3 to 8.

3. Yn rheoliad 2(1) (dehongli), yn y diffiniad o "Directive 94/54", mewnosoder ar y diwedd y geiriau "and Commission Directive 2004/77/EC(1)".

4. Yn rheoliad 23(2A) (bwyd nad yw wedi ei ragbectynnu a bwyd tebyg, a chynhyrchion cyffaith ffansi) mewnosoder ar y diwedd yr ymadrodd "or regulation 34C".

5. Yn rheoliad 26 (pecynnau bach a photeli gwydr penodol sydd wedi'u marcio'n annileadwy), ym mharagraffau (1)(a)(ii) a (3A) yn lle'r geiriau "regulations 33 and 34" rhodder y geiriau "regulations 33, 34 and 34C".

6. Yn rheoliad 27(1) (bwyd yd penodol a werthir mewn sefydliadau arlwyd), yn lle'r geiriau "regulations 32, 33, 34 and 34B" rhodder y geiriau "regulations 32, 33, 34, 34B and 34C".

7. Ar ôl rheoliad 34B (bwyd yd sy'n cynnwys cynhwysion alergenig neu gynhwysion sy'n dod o gynhwysion alergenig) mewnosoder y rheoliad canlynol -

"Confectionery and drinks containing glycyrrhizic acid or its ammonium salt

34C.-(1) This regulation applies to any confectionery or drink which contains glycyrrhizic acid or its ammonium salt as a result of the addition of that acid or salt as such or of the liquorice plant *Glycyrrhiza glabra*, and references in this regulation to "relevant concentration" are to the concentration of that acid or salt in the food -

- (a) manufactured as ready for consumption or,
- (b) if it is not so manufactured, as reconstituted according to its manufacturer's instructions.

(2) In the case of -

- (a) any confectionery which contains a relevant concentration of at least 100mg/kg but less than 4 g/kg,
- (b) any drink which contains more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and a relevant concentration of at least 10 mg/l but less than 300 mg/l, and
- (c) any drink which does not contain more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and which contains a relevant concentration of at least 10 mg/l but less than 50 mg/l,

that food shall be marked or labelled with the indication "contains liquorice", unless the term "liquorice" appears in the list of ingredients or in the name of the food.

(3) In the case of -

3. In regulation 2(1) (interpretation), in the definition of "Directive 94/54" insert at the end the words "and Commission Directive 2004/77/EC(1)".

4. In regulation 23(2A) (food which is not prepacked and similar food, and fancy confectionery products) insert at the end the expression "or regulation 34C".

5. In regulation 26 (small packages and certain indelibly marked bottles), in paragraphs (1)(a)(ii) and (3A) for the words "regulations 33 and 34" substitute the words "regulations 33, 34 and 34C".

6. In regulation 27(1) (certain food sold at catering establishments), for the words "regulations 32, 33, 34 and 34B" be substitute the words "regulations 32, 33, 34, 34B and 34C".

7. After regulation 34B (foods containing allergenic ingredients or ingredients originating from allergenic ingredients) insert the following regulation -

"Confectionery and drinks containing glycyrrhizic acid or its ammonium salt

34C.-(1) This regulation applies to any confectionery or drink which contains glycyrrhizic acid or its ammonium salt as a result of the addition of that acid or salt as such or of the liquorice plant *Glycyrrhiza glabra*, and references in this regulation to "relevant concentration" are to the concentration of that acid or salt in the food -

- (a) manufactured as ready for consumption or,
- (b) if it is not so manufactured, as reconstituted according to its manufacturer's instructions.

(2) In the case of -

- (a) any confectionery which contains a relevant concentration of at least 100mg/kg but less than 4 g/kg,
- (b) any drink which contains more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and a relevant concentration of at least 10 mg/l but less than 300 mg/l, and
- (c) any drink which does not contain more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and which contains a relevant concentration of at least 10 mg/l but less than 50 mg/l,

that food shall be marked or labelled with the indication "contains liquorice", unless the term "liquorice" appears in the list of ingredients or in the name of the food.

- (a) any confectionery which contains a relevant concentration of at least 4g/kg,
- (b) any drink which contains more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and a relevant concentration of at least 300 mg/l, and
- (c) any drink which does not contain more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and which contains a relevant concentration of at least 50 mg/l,

that food shall be marked or labelled with the indication "contains liquorice - people suffering from hypertension should avoid excessive consumption".

(4) The indications required by paragraphs (2) and (3) of this regulation shall appear immediately after the list of ingredients or, in the absence of such a list, near the name of the food."

8. Yn rheoliad 50 (darpariaeth drosiannol), mewnosoder ar y diwedd y paragraff canlynol -

"(13) In any proceedings for an offence under regulation 44(1)(a), it shall be a defence to prove that -

- (a) the food concerned was marked or labelled before 20 May 2006; and
- (b) the matters constituting the alleged offence would not have constituted an offence under these Regulations if the amendment made by regulation 7 of the Food Labelling (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005 had not been in operation when the food was sold."

- (a) any confectionery which contains a relevant concentration of at least 4g/kg,
- (b) any drink which contains more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and a relevant concentration of at least 300 mg/l, and
- (c) any drink which does not contain more than 1.2 per cent by volume of alcohol and which contains a relevant concentration of at least 50 mg/l,

that food shall be marked or labelled with the indication "contains liquorice - people suffering from hypertension should avoid excessive consumption".

(4) The indications required by paragraphs (2) and (3) of this regulation shall appear immediately after the list of ingredients or, in the absence of such a list, near the name of the food."

8. In regulation 50 (transitional provision), insert at the end the following paragraph -

"(13) In any proceedings for an offence under regulation 44(1)(a), it shall be a defence to prove that -

- (a) the food concerned was marked or labelled before 20 May 2006; and
- (b) the matters constituting the alleged offence would not have constituted an offence under these Regulations if the amendment made by regulation 7 of the Food Labelling (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005 had not been in operation when the food was sold."
