**The A5 Trunk Road (Holyhead
Road, Betws-y-Coed, Conwy
County Borough) (Temporary
Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2015**

Made 8 September 2015

Coming into force 12 September 2015

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the London – Holyhead Trunk Road (A5) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited because of the World Mountain Running Championships event being held on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), as amended by the Road Traffic (Special Events) Act 1994, and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 12 September 2015 and its title is The A5 Trunk Road (Holyhead Road, Betws-y-Coed, Conwy County Borough) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2015.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“closure period” (“*y cyfnod cau*”) means that period commencing at 08:00 hours on 12 September 2015 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed;

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means:

(i) any vehicle being used for the purposes of the police, fire or ambulance services;

(ii) any vehicle being used in connection with works to the road or lighting or traffic signs or emergency works to any sewer or to any main or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or

telecommunications in, or in any land adjacent to, a length of road concerned;

(iii) any vehicle used by an authorised event official in support of and for safety reasons of the event;

“the lengths of the trunk road” (“*y darnau o’r gefnffordd*”) means:

i. the length of the trunk road at Betws-y-Coed in the County Borough of Conwy that extends from a point 10 metres north-west of its junction with Church Road to a point 10 metres south-east of its junction with Ffordd Craiglan; and

ii. the length of the trunk road at Betws-y-Coed in the County Borough of Conwy that extends from a point 10 metres north-west of its junction with Church Road to a point 10 metres south-east of its junction with Station Road.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. Subject to the provisions of article 4 no person shall, during the closure period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed in the lengths of the trunk road.

Application

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 8 days.
