# PLANT HEALTH, WALES

The Plant Health (Forestry) (Amendment) (Wales) Order 2015

Made	24 September 2015
Laid before the National	
Assembly for Wales	29 September 2015

The Welsh Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2 and 3(1) of the Plant Health Act 1967 <sup>MI</sup> and paragraph 1A of Schedule 2 to the European Communities Act 1972 <sup>M2</sup>.

This Order makes provision for a purpose mentioned in section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972<sup>M3</sup>. It appears to the Welsh Ministers that it is expedient for the references to the European Union instruments mentioned in article 2(a)(ii) and (vii) to be construed as references to those instruments as amended from time to time.
