Parts 3 and 4 of the Act (<i>assessing and meeting needs for care and support</i>)	In so far as they relate to meeting the needs of persons over the age of 18 who have been assessed under section 19 of the Act as having needs for care and support because they are dependent on alcohol or drugs, or because they are victims of domestic violence or abuse, have a history of violent or abusive behaviour or because they have a mental disorder.
