**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A48 Trunk Road (Eastbound  
Carriageway from Pensarn  
Roundabout, Carmarthen to  
Nantycaws, Carmarthenshire)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles)  
Order 2016**

*Made* 6 September 2016

*Coming into force* 12 September 2016

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the London – Fishguard Trunk Road (A48) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

1. This Order comes into force on 12 September 2016 and its title is The A48 Trunk Road (Eastbound Carriageway from Pensarn Roundabout, Carmarthen to Nantycaws, Carmarthenshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2016.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road in the County of Carmarthenshire that extends from its junction with the eastern side of Pensarn Roundabout to its junction with the B4310 leading to Nantycaws;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 00:01 hours on 12 September 2016 and ending when the temporary traffic signs have been permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

**Prohibition**

3. No person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of the trunk road.

**Application**

4. The prohibition in article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

**Duration of this Order**

5. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 18 months.
