**PART 5**

**Works on public land**

**Meaning of “statutory works”**

**14.** For the purpose of paragraph 28(3)(b) of Schedule 3, “statutory works” means works that may be carried out by a person under any of the following provisions—

- (a) section 159 of the Water Industry Act 1991<sup>(1)</sup> (power to lay, inspect, maintain etc. pipes);
- (b) Schedule 4 to the Gas Act 1986<sup>(2)</sup> (power to dig up streets);
- (c) paragraph 10(4) of Schedule 4 to the Electricity Act 1989<sup>(3)</sup> (power to make boreholes);
- (d) Schedule 3A to the Communications Act 2003<sup>(4)</sup>.
