**The Education (Amendments Relating to Teacher Assessment Information) (Wales) Regulations 2018**

**Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (Wales) Regulations 2007**

2. The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (Wales) Regulations 2007 <sup>M1</sup> are amended as follows—

- (a) in regulation 5(2)—
  - (i) omit sub-paragraph (c); and
  - (ii) in sub-paragraph (e) for “the Skills Funding Agency” substitute “ the Education and Skills Funding Agency <sup>M2</sup> ”; and
- (b) for paragraph 1 in Part 2 of Schedule 2 substitute—

“1.—(1) The following information—

- (a) whether the pupil is or was studying towards a Welsh Baccalaureate Qualification; and
- (b) the title of each learning activity the pupil is or was studying.

(2) This paragraph applies to each person who—

- (a) is a pupil in the school's sixth form during the school year in which the request for the information was made;
- (b) was a pupil in the school's sixth form at any previous time during the school year in which the request for the information was made; or
- (c) was a pupil in the school's sixth form in the year immediately preceding the school year in which the request for the information was made.”
