The A487 Trunk Road (Castle Street and Eryri Terrace, Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2018

Made 17 July 2018

Coming into force 20 July 2018

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 Trunk Road, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of North Wales Police, make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (Castle Street and Eryri Terrace, Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2018 and it comes into force on 20 July 2018.

2. In this Order:

"disabled person's badge" ("bathodyn person anabl") has the meaning given in regulation 2(1) of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000(2);

"parking disc" ("disg parcio") has the meaning given in regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000(3);

"the relevant position" ("y safle perthnasol") has the meaning given by regulation 4 of the Local

Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

"the trunk road" ("y gefnffordd") means the A487 Fishguard to Bangor Trunk Road.

Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time

3. Except as provided in article 4, no person may cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Exemptions

- **4.**—(1) Nothing in article 3 renders it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order for so long as may be necessary to enable:
 - (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle to be used in connection with any of the following operations:
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of the trunk road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of the trunk road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any electronic communications apparatus as defined in paragraph 5 of Schedule 3A to the Communications Act 2003(4);
 - (d) the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory functions;
 - (e) the vehicle to take petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of trunk road;
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (g) the vehicle to stop when the person in control of it:
 - (i) is required by law to stop;
 - (ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident;
 - (iii) is prevented from proceeding; or

- (iv) is acting upon the direction, or with the permission, of a police constable, police community support officer or civil enforcement officer.
- (2) Nothing in article 3 renders it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule for a period not exceeding 3 hours, being a period separated by an interval of at least 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same day on the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE

The length of the southern side of the trunk road known as Castle Street, Penrhyndeudraeth that extends from a point 20 metres east of the centrepoint of its junction with the eastern end of Adwy Ddu to a point 74 metres east of the centrepoint of that junction.

The length of the southern side of the trunk road known as Eryri Terrace, Penrhyndeudraeth that extends from a point 10 metres west of the centrepoint of its junction with the eastern end of Adwy Ddu to a point 69 metres west of the centrepoint of that junction.

The length of the northern side of the trunk road known as Castle Street/Eryri Terrace, Penrhyndeudraeth that extends from a point 5 metres east of the centrepoint of its junction with the road leading to Bro Llewelyn to a point 87 metres east of the centrepoint of that junction.
