**The School Performance and Absence Targets  
(Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2019**

The Welsh Ministers in exercise of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by sections 19 and 54(3) and (4) of the Education Act 1997<sup>(1)</sup> and sections 30(1) and (2) and 210 of the Education Act 2002<sup>(2)</sup> and now vested in them<sup>(3)</sup>, make the following Regulations:
